## Minimize a Prominent Nose



**DO!**

**PENELOPE CRUZ's** swept-back style works; big hair draws attention to the nose.



**DON'T!**

**Simplify your style** “Dramatic hair, like heavy bangs, a center part or a big, rounded hairstyle, can draw attention to the center of the face,” says Evangelista. His suggestion? Stick to soft and polished looks like a half-updo.

**Contour nose** Lightly brush a matte contour powder down either side of your nose, says Roncal. “The shadows minimize a wide nose.”

## Slim Down Full Cheeks

**Highlight cheekbones** Sweep a bright blush from cheekbones to the temples, then shade the hollows with a contour powder. Roncal's tip? “Make a fish face: It shows you where to contour.”

**Style hair to lengthen face** A shoulder-grazing or longer cut is best. Avoid styles where hair falls near the ears, where the face is widest.
